We are now in our third month of serving our "King's Kitchen" Community Meal Outreach. Our most recent meal was served on June 15, and included KOG's famous "Breakfast for Dinner" menu. We served approximately 30 guests with the help of KOG and community volunteers. July was also our first opportunity to serve on the first Thursday of the month, and we offered a menu of BBQ chicken sandwiches. Mark your calendar for the summer months when the "King's Kitchen" is open again on Thursday, July 20, August 17 and August 31.

Our volunteers both young and old(er) spoke of how blessed they felt to be able to provide this outreach to our community. The smiles and conversation among our volunteers and guests has helped us all to connect as the body of Christ, which was echoed in Pastor Kinndlee's devotion shared before the meal.

In addition to dinner, we provided a "Blessings Table" for those in attendance, where our guests could choose from various food, clothing, or personal care items they might need. (This was thanks to some generous donations.) In addition, prayer request cards were filled out by our guests, and we will certainly be praying for them in the coming weeks and months.

The "King's Kitchen" community meal outreach will take place the third Thursday of each month, and on the fifth Thursdays in June, August, and November 2017, from 5:30pm – 7pm. We need volunteers in order to serve our upcoming "King's Kitchen" meals, so please consider lending a hand, whether it's helping to prepare a meal, shopping, serving, greeting, cleaning up, or being a "table host" and chatting with our guests. This is also a great opportunity to activate one of your Thrivent Action Teams to help underwrite the cost of supplies. Sign-up sheets are located at the Welcome Place before and after both services on Sundays, or just show up.

Also, please consider personally inviting a friend or neighbor to join you in volunteering; it's a great way to introduce them to KOG and to experience the joy of serving together. (We can also sign off on required volunteer hours for students or scouts.) Meal prep begins around 4pm, and we are usually finished with cleanup by 8pm. Come for the duration, or for any length of time you can give.

ELCA to celebrate 500th anniversary of the Reformation with public event in D.C.

The Rev. Elizabeth A. Eaton, presiding bishop of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA), will host a commemoration of the 500th anniversary of the Reformation on Oct. 31 at the Lutheran Church of the Reformation in Washington, D.C.

Eaton will be joined by the Rev. William O. Gafkjen, bishop of the ELCA Indiana-Kentucky Synod and chair of the ELCA Conference of Bishops; the Rev. Richard H. Graham, bishop of the ELCA Metropolitan Washington, D.C., Synod; and ELCA Vice President Bill Horne.

The event, which will meet under the theme "Looking Back and Called Forward," will be available online via livestream for all to watch.



About the 500th anniversary of the Reformation

Martin Luther posted the Ninety-Five Theses in Wittenberg, Germany, on Oct. 31, 1517, and the resulting debate about Christian teaching and practice led to changes that have shaped the course of Western Christianity for almost 500 years. The Reformation offers to Christians everywhere a liberating way of listening to and sharing the word of God. It teaches that Christ's life flows through faith into a life of service to the neighbor and offers the promise of God's love that makes possible a life of "living, daring confidence in God's grace."

ELCA congregations, members, synods and affiliated institutions are observing the 500th anniversary of the Reformation in a variety of events and activities. Many of the local activities reflect the magnitude of work being done on a national and international scale. In all the activities, the ELCA seeks to find in this historic milestone an occasion to give a confident and joyful witness of the life and freedom in Jesus Christ that is for all.
