Pastor's Corner...

Dear King of Glory family and friends,

I hope your summer has been going well and that you've been enjoying our summer sermon series, ***God at the Oscars***. We have just a couple movies left for the month of August. On Sunday, Aug. 6, we'll be wrapping up our VBS week and discussing the movie *Zootopia*. *Zootopia* is a really fun and insightful animated movie by Pixar and I highly recommend it for all ages. Then on Sunday, Aug. 13, we'll be ending our series with the film *Manchester by the Sea* and talking about the keys to forgiveness. This film is a tougher one to watch (definitely could be labeled a tragic film), so if you have experienced any deep losses or are just a bit more tender-hearted, you should look up a synopsis or read some reviews before viewing the film just to make sure it's not going to be too much for you.

Additionally, I would love to get feedback from you as to what you thought about our summer series. Would you like to do it again? Make it a summer tradition? Or do you have any films you'd like to hear a sermon on or have a theological discussion about? Please don't hesitate to send your thoughts, comments and questions my way! I think looking at secular films through the lens of our faith is a great way to stretch our Christian critical thinking muscles and good practice as to how to converse with the secular culture in which we live. Much can be learned from all forms of art, especially the non-religious. Plus, rather than being an adversary of pagan culture, Saint Paul himself used to make a point of learning the common culture around him, whether in Rome or Corinth or Galatia (I Cor. 9), in order to better attract and engage those who had not yet heard or experienced the good news of Jesus Christ. I hope this summer series has opened your eyes to new ways of seeing and discussing today's secular films.

Also coming up this month is our **Back to School Sunday, Aug. 30**, where we will be blessing students and their backpacks along with any school workers and their briefcases or work bags. This would be a GREAT Sunday to invite your neighbors, coworkers or grandchildren to join you for worship, so they can experience King of Glory and be blessed during our service. Plus, after each service, we'll be serving up Root Beer Floats!!! And who doesn't love a root beer float ☺

Lastly, I wanted to share some news with you regarding a ministry we have partnered with in the past which is undergoing a time of tribulation. **Beach Cities Interfaith Services (BCIS)** is an organization in Huntington Beach overseen by Rev. Karen Maurer of the Episcopalian Church in HB. We have supplied sack lunches and other material goods for BCIS in the past, as they focus on helping the homeless in this area. They supply meals, clothing, hygiene products and other critical services to anyone who walks into their doors, and they're very good about keeping people accountable and responsible in the use of their services. Despite their important ministry efforts, BCIS has recently been told by the Mayor and Council of Huntington Beach that they are being evicted from the city's property where they operate and that they have just a few months to relocate their organization. Why this is happening depends on who you ask, but it is not uncommon for organizations who help the homeless to be targeted

by city officials who would prefer to sweep the homeless under the proverbial rug (i.e. push them into another community) rather than supporting services that assist them. I invite you to pray with me in the coming months that BCIS is able to find a way to continue its critical ministry and that God's Spirit may guide them in their negotiations with the city.

Blessings to you all as you finish up your summer trips and staycations! We have a BIG fall ahead with a new 6 week Growth Group study and a fun sermon series on how we Lutherans are still being Re-formed 500 years after the Reformation. We hope you can join us for it!

Upcoming Changes to the Patio Cover:

I’m sure you’ve noticed the posts in the covered walkway between Little Ed and the Fellowship Center are no long standing straight and upright. Over the years, efforts have been made to brace and support the structure. However, we believe it is time to take down the southern section of the Patio Cover.

We are in the process of investigating the safest and most economical way to remove it. Before it is taken down, the wiring for the lighting and the PVC water pipes will need to be disconnected. Additionally, the sign directing visitors to the accessible restrooms will need to be relocated. Once the cover is removed, additional work will be needed to remove the post footings and fill in the openings with pavers.



Long term planning is needed to figure out how KOG intends on using the Patio in the future. One idea that is under consideration is to install an arched opening in the wall at the north end of the patio between Little Ed and Big Ed. The patio pavers might be extended out into the area currently covered by lawn. A fenced in yard could be established so youth from our congregation and the community could have a place to safely play. This is the same area temporarily fenced during VBS each year.

We will keep you updated as to when the demolition will commence.

ELCA to celebrate 500th anniversary of the Reformation with public event in D.C.

The Rev. Elizabeth A. Eaton, presiding bishop of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA), will host a commemoration of the 500th anniversary of the Reformation on Oct. 31 at the Lutheran Church of the Reformation in Washington, D.C.

Eaton will be joined by the Rev. William O. Gafkjen, bishop of the ELCA Indiana-Kentucky Synod and chair of the ELCA Conference of Bishops; the Rev. Richard H. Graham, bishop of the ELCA Metropolitan Washington, D.C., Synod; and ELCA Vice President Bill Horne.

The event, which will meet under the theme "Looking Back and Called Forward," will be available online via livestream for all to watch.

The event will be open to the public and available online via livestream. All are invited to participate and honor the Reformation anniversary as the ELCA bears public witness to Christ, who frees us to love and serve our neighbor, and as we look to the future to which God is calling us.

The Reformation offers to Christians everywhere a liberating way of listening to and sharing the word of God. It teaches that Christ's life flows through faith into a life of service to the neighbor and offers the promise of God's love that makes possible a life of "living, daring confidence in God's grace."

ELCA congregations, members, synods and affiliated institutions are observing the 500th anniversary of the Reformation in a variety of events and activities. Many of the local activities reflect the magnitude of work being done on a national and international scale. In all the activities, the ELCA seeks to find in this historic milestone an occasion to give a confident and joyful witness of the life and freedom in Jesus Christ that is for all.

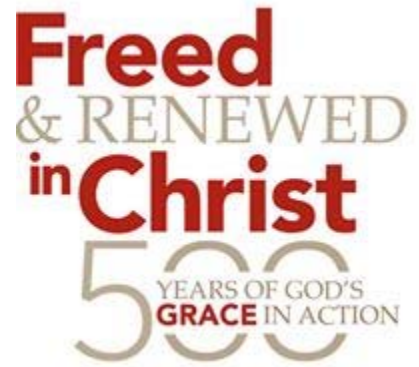
KOG Weekly Food Donations:
